Yesterday, March 11, Kenwood Care updated our visitor policy. Upon further examination, we have concluded that given the grave danger this virus poses to our resident population, we need to further restrict visitors.

**At this time, we are limiting visitors to only essential medical personnel.**

**We ask that family and friends DO NOT visit our homes for the time being.**

Ensuring our residents are shielded from any potential exposure in a safe and healthy environment is our primary concern.

“Older people and those with underlying health conditions are at a significantly higher risk from COVID-19, with morbidity and mortality rates that are three to five times higher than most flu seasons.”-Governor Larry Hogan

Kenwood Care has already suspended visits from any non-essential visitors:  
Therapists, Activities Coordinator, Entertainers, Religious Volunteers, Private Aids,  
Delivery People etc.

Kenwood Care continues to practice and monitor safe protocols for all its staff and the operation of all our homes during this public health event.

We understand family members interest in staying close to loved ones and can offer contact through phone calls and are working to add other modes of contact through such methods as Skype.

We greatly appreciate your support during this difficult time. If we are diligent about our procedures, we will eliminate the possibility of transmission to our residents.
